



#### A NEW ARCHBISHOP FOR BOSTON

This past week we learned who will be our next Archbishop. It will be His Excellency Richard G. Henning, the current Bishop of

Providence, Rhode Island. According to the Announcement made at the beginning of the week His Excellency will be formally installed as Archbishop of Boston on October 31st, the Vigil of All Saints. The era of Cardinal Sean's stewardship will draw to its peaceful close and a new era for the life of our local church will begin. We want to make sure to do our part to welcome our new Archbishop and support him



in the office of great responsibility which Pope Francis has placed upon him. Archbishop Henning's Coat-of-Arms takes the motto *Put Out Into The Deep*. These words are taken from the Gospel scene where Christ commands Simon Peter to "launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a draught" (Luke 5:4). Peter is reluctant to do so.





### **SCRIPTURE READINGS** for the 19th SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (YEAR B)

Today's Missal, pp. 42-43

#### Lesson (First Reading):

I Kings 19:4-8

"Elijah got up, ate, and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God. Horeb."

### Epistle (Second Reading):

Ephesians 4:30-5:2

"All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice. And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ."

#### Gospel Lesson: Jesus is the Living Bread John 6:41-51

#### LATIN MASS PROPERS: TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 69:2-3. O GOD, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me: let mine enemies be confounded and ashamed, who seek my soul. *Ps. ibid. 4.* Let them be turned backward and blush for shame, who desire evils to me.  $\rlap{/}{V}$ . Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — O God, come to my assistance ... COLLECT: O ALMIGHTY and merciful God, of whose gift it cometh that Thy faithful do unto Thee worthy and laudable service: grant us, we beseech Thee, that we may run without stumbling towards the attainment of Thy promises. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Second Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians, 3. 4-9. BRETHREN: Such confidence we have through Christ towards God. Not that we are sufficient to think anything of ourselves, as of ourselves: but our sufficiency is from God. Who also hath made us fit ministers of the new testament, not in the letter, but in the spirit: for the letter killeth, but the spirit quickeneth. Now if the ministration of death, engraven with letters upon stones, was glorious, so that the children of Israel could not steadfastly behold the face of Moses, for the glory of his countenance; which is made void: how shall not the ministration of the Spirit be rather in glory? For if the ministration of condemnation be glory, much more the ministration of justice aboundeth in glory.

GRADUAL: Psalm 33:2-3. I WILL bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall ever be in my mouth. In the Lord shall my soul be praised: let the meek hear, and rejoice. ALLELUIA: Psalm 87:2. Alleluia, Alleluia. O Lord, the God of my salvation, I have cried in the day and in the night before Thee. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Luke, 10. 23-37. AT THAT TIME, Jesus said to His disciples: Blessed are the eyes that see the things which you see. For I say to you, that many prophets and kings have desired to see the things that you see, and have not seen them; and to hear the things that you hear, and have not heard them. And behold a certain lawyer stood up, tempting Him, and saying: Master, what must I do to possess eternal life? But He said to him: What is written in the law? how readest thou? He answering, said: Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself. And He said to him: Thou hast answered rightly: this do, and thou shalt live. But he, wishing to justify himself, said to Jesus: And who is my neighbor? And Jesus answering, said: A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among robbers, who also stripped him, and having wounded him went away, leaving him half dead. And it chanced that a certain priest went down the same way, and seeing him, passed by. In like manner also a Levite, when he was near the place and saw him, passed by. But a certain Samaritan being on his journey, came near him, and seeing him, was moved with compassion, and going up to him, bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine; and setting him upon his own beast, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. And the next day he took out two pence, and gave to the host, and said: Take care of him, and whatsoever thou shalt spend over and above, I, at my return, will repay thee. Which of these three, in thine opinion, was neighbor to him that fell among robbers? But he said: He that showed mercy to him. And Jesus said to him: Go and do thou in like manner.

OFFERTORY: Exodus 32: 11. 13. 14. MOSES prayed in the sight of the Lord his God, and said: Why, O Lord, is Thine indignation enkindled against Thy people? Let the anger of Thy mind cease; remember Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to whom Thou didst swear to give a land flowing with milk and honey. And the Lord was appeased from doing the evil which He had spoken of doing against his people. SECRET: GRACIOUSLY look upon the offerings, we beseech Thee, O Lord, which we present upon Thine altar: that while they obtain pardon for us, they may give honor to Thy name. Through our Lord ... COMMUNION: Psalm 103: 13. 14-15 THE earth shall be filled with the fruit of Thy works, O Lord, that Thou mayest bring bread out of the earth, and that wine may cheer the heart of man; that he may makethe face cheerful with oil; and that bread may strengthen man's heart.




