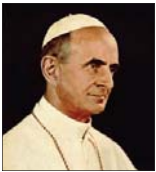

the hounds picked up the scent of St. Giles's deer. In terror, the animal fled to her protector's cave. As he held her in his protective embrace the hunter's arrow aimed at her pierced St. Giles's hand, which never afterward healed. He bore it for the rest of his life as a kind of stigmata.

The refuge of the holy man being revealed, men seeking his guidance sought him in the wilderness. The King of France compelled him to become the abbot of the new monastery. As he also had the gift of miracles, crowds of people came to see him.

Upon his death, the place which now bore his name became more and more frequented as a place of pilgrimage. In the Middle Ages, St. Giles ranked with Rome and Santiago de Compostela as one of the three great pilgrimages of Western Europe.

ST. GILES, HOLY ABBOT AND HERMIT

We begin the Month of September with the Feast of St. Giles (+7th Century A.D.), who is one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers, invoked especially against the evils of panic,

epilepsy, madness and night terrors. According to legend, he was a wealthy Athenian who had renounced his fortune and hidden himself as a hermit-monk in Provence. He lived only on herbs and water until the Lord sent him a female deer to nourish him with her milk. One day, when the royal huntsmen were nearby,

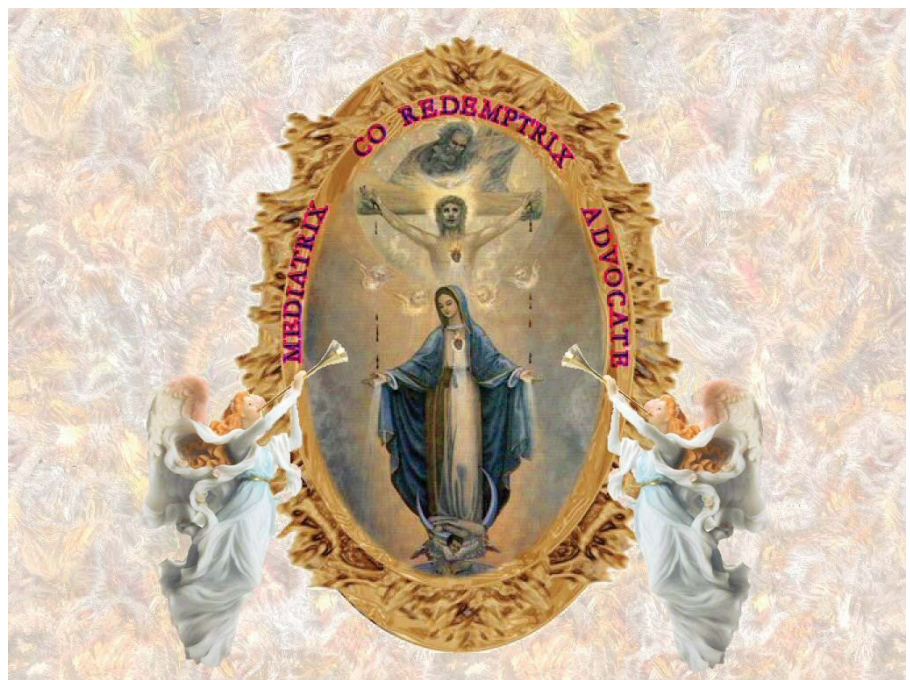

LATIN MASS PROPERS: FIFTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



INTROIT: Psalm 85. 1, 2, 3. **INCLINE** Thine ear, O Lord, to me and hear me: save Thy servant, O my God, that trusteth in Thee: have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all the day. *Ps. ibid.* 4. Give joy to the soul of Thy Servant; for to Thee, O Lord, I have lifted up my soul. *V̄.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — Incline Thine ear, O Lord ...

COLLECT LET Thy continual pity, O Lord, cleanse and defend Thy Church: and because it cannot continue in safety without Thee, may it ever be governed by Thy goodness. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Galatians, 5. 25-26; 6. 1-10. **BRETHREN:** If we live in the spirit, let us also walk in the spirit. Let us not be made desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, and if a man be

overtaken in any fault, you, who are spiritual, instruct such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfill the law of Christ. For if any man think himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. But let everyone prove his own work, and so he shall have glory in himself only, and not in another. For every one shall bear his own burden. And let him that is instructed in the word, communicate to him that instructeth him, in all good things. Be not deceived, God is not mocked; for what things a man shall sow, those also shall he reap. For he that soweth in his flesh, of the flesh also shall reap corruption: but he that soweth in the spirit, of the spirit shall reap life everlasting. And in doing good, let us not fail; for in due time we shall reap, not failing. Therefore, whilst we have time, let us work good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of the faith.


