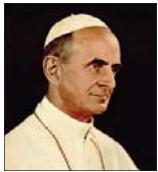

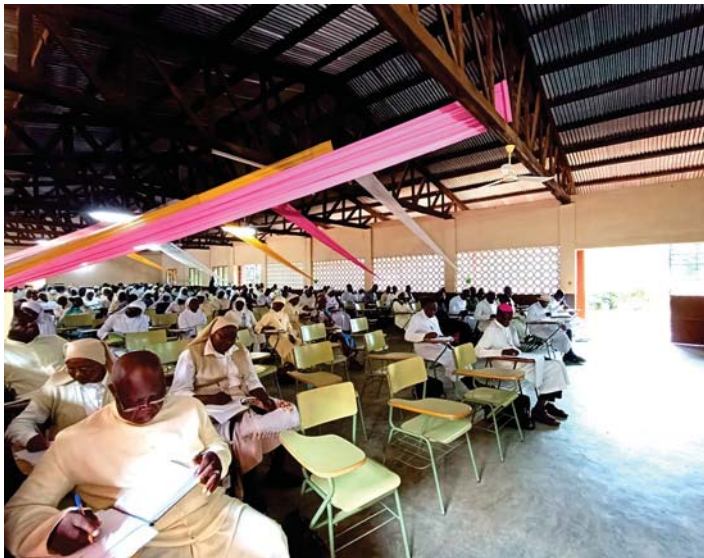

FRONT COVER: St. John Cantius (St. John of Kenty), +1473. The artist is Tadeusz Zukotynicki (1855-1912) and it shows the Saint in Krakow, handing over a damaged jug with fresh milk to a hungry and grateful woman. This painting is in the church of St. Jan Kanty in Chicago, Illinois. St. John Cantius was a priest and professor of the sacred sciences at the University of Krakow. He was very solicitous of the poor and generous in his almsdeeds. He died on Christmas Eve. His Feast is observed in the Old Calendar today and in the New Calendar on December 23rd.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: THE TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



INTROIT: Psalm 129: 3-4 If Thou shalt observe iniquities, O Lord, Lord, who shall endure it? for with Thee is propitiation, O God of Israel. **Psalm 129: 1-2** From the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my voice. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, our refuge and strength, who art the author of all godliness; hear, we pray Thee, the devout prayers of Thy Church, and grant that what we ask confidently we may obtain effectually. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: Philippians 1: 6-11 Brethren, we are confident in the Lord Jesus, that He who hath begun a good work in you, will perfect it unto the day of Christ Jesus. As it is meet for me to think this for you all, for that I have you in my heart; and that, in my bands and in the defense and confirmation of the Gospel, you are all partakers of my joy. For God is my witness, how I long after you all in the depths of Jesus Christ. And this I pray, that your charity may more and more abound in knowledge and in all understanding; that you may approve the better things; that you may be sincere and without offense unto the day of Christ; filled with the fruit of justice,

through Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God.

GRADUAL: Psalm 132: 1-2 Behold how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity. *V.* It is like the precious ointment on the head, that ran down upon the beard, the beard of Aaron.

ALLELUIA: Psalm 113: 11 Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* They that fear the Lord, let them hope in Him; He is their helper and protector. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Matthew 22: 15-21 **At** that time, the Pharisees went and consulted among themselves, how to ensnare Jesus in His speech. And they sent to Him their disciples, with the Herodians, saying: Master, we know that Thou art a true speaker, and teachest the way of God in truth, neither carest Thou for any man, for Thou dost not regard the person of men. Tell us therefore, what dost Thou think? Is it lawful to give tribute to Caesar, or not? But Jesus knowing their wickedness, said: Why do you tempt Me, ye hypocrites? Show me the coin of the tribute. And they offered Him a penny. And Jesus saith to them: Whose image and superscription is this? They say to Him: Caesar's. Then He saith to them: Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's; and to God the things that are God's.

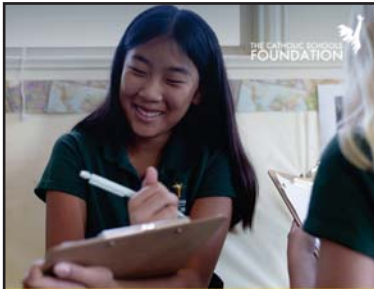

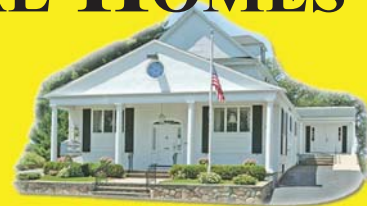

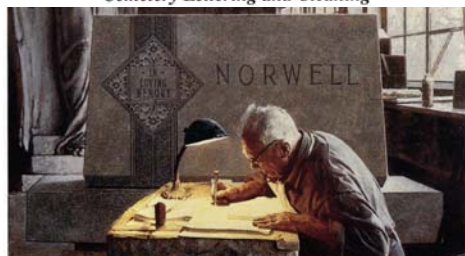
