ROMAN STATIONAL CHURCH FIRST SUNDAY IN THE ADVENT OF THE LORD: ST. MARY MAJOR, "ST. MARY AT THE CRIB"

The stational church is St. Mary Major at the Crib and its stational Saint meets us! Already on this first day of our preparation for Christmas, we see the Mother of God at the Crib! 

LATIN MASS PROPERS: FIRST SUNDAY OF THE ADVENT OF THE LORD

INTROIT: Psalm 24. 1-4. TO Thee have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. *Ps. ibid.* 4. Show me, O Lord, Thy ways: and teach me Thy paths. \tilde{V} . Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — To Thee ...

COLLECT: STIR up Thy power, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and come: that from the threatening dangers of our sins, we may deserve to be rescued by Thy protection, and be saved by Thy deliverance: Who livest and reignest with God the Father, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans, 13. 11-14 BRETHREN, knowing that it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep. For now our salvation is nearer than when we believed. The night is passed and the day is at hand. Let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light. Let us walk honestly, as in the day: not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and impurities, not in contention and envy: but put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ.

But when these things begin to come to pass, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is at hand. 


