ROMAN STATIONAL CHURCH FOURTH SUNDAY IN THE ADVENT OF THE LORD: BASILICA OF THE TWELVE HOLY APOSTLES

"Formerly this Sunday was aliturgical because the Ember Day ceremonies lasted well into Sunday morning. Later, when its liturgy was transferred to Saturday morning, another formulary was composed from the texts of the Ember Day Masses. Accordingly, the Introit, Gradual and Communion are as on Wednesday and the Gospel as on Saturday. Thus today's Mass serves as a belated Ember Day observance for those of the faithful who for some reason could not participate during the week; or we may regard it as a kind of Ember Day observance for the whole assembled community—a grateful reminder of the past three months and a covenant renewal for the coming quarter [vear]."

LATIN MASS PROPERS: SUNDAY AFTER CHRISTMAS

INTROIT: Wisdom 18: 14-15 While all things were in quiet silence, and the night was in the midst of her course, Thy almighty Word, O Lord, came down from heaven from Thy royal throne. *Psalm 92: 1* The Lord hath reigned, He is clothed with beauty: the Lord is clothed with strength, and hath girded Himself. *V. Glory* be to the Father.

COLLECT Almighty and everlasting God, direct our actions according to Thy good pleasure: that we may deserve to abound in good works in the name of Thy beloved Son: Who with Thee liveth.

EPISTLE: Galatians 4: 1-7 Brethren, as long as the heir is a child, he differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all: but is under tutors and governors until the time appointed by the father: so we also, when we were children, were serving under the elements of the world. But when the fullness of the time was come, God sent His Son, made of a woman, made under the law, that He might redeem them who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. And because you are sons, God hath sent the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying: Abba, Father. Therefore now he is not a servant, but a son: and if a son, an heir also through God.

GRADUAL: Psalm 44: 3, 2 Thou art beautiful above the sons of men: grace is poured abroad in Thy lips. *V.* My heart hath uttered a good word, I speak my words to the king: my tongue is the pen of a scrivener, that writeth swiftly. **ALLELUIA Psalm 92:** 1 Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* the Lord hath reigned, He is clothed with beauty: the Lord is clothed with strength, and hat girded Himself with might. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Luke 2: 33-40 At that time Joseph and Mary the Mother of Jesus were wondering at those things which were spoken concerning Him. And Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary His mother: Behold, this child is set for the fall, and for the resurrection of many in Israel: and for a sign which shall be contradicted: and thy own soul a sword shall pierce, that out of many hearts thoughts may be revealed. And there was one Anna a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Aser: she was far advanced in years, and had lived with her husband seven years from her virginity. And she was a widow until fourscore and four years: who departed not from the temple, by fastings and prayers serving night and day. Now she, at the same hour, coming in, confessed to the Lord: and spoke of Him to all that looked for the redemption of Israel. And after they had performed all things according to the law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee to their city Nazareth. And the Child grew and waxed strong, full of wisdom: and the grace of God was in Him.


