

#### IHS = Symbol of the Holy Name of Jesus

St. Bernardine of Siena (+1444 A.D.) spread devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus ("Jesus" means "Yahweh Is Salvation") by means of the inscription of the monogram IHS. It is an abbreviation of the name "Jesus" by using the first three letters of the Lord's Name according to the Greek alphabet (The New Testament of the Bible was originally written in Greek).

St. Bernardine also popularized the addition of the name "Jesus" to the "Hail Mary"— "Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, JESUS."





# THE EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION FOR 2025 IN THE YEAR OF GRACE (The Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts:)

Know, dear brethren, that as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of His Resurrection who is our Savior:

The 16th Day of February is the Sunday of Septuagesima.

On the 5th Day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the Fast of the most sacred Lenten Season.

On the 20th Day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 29th Day of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 8th Day of June, the Feast of Pentecost.

On the 19th Day of June, the Feast of Corpus Christi.

On the 30th Day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of Our Lord Jesus Christ, to Whom is honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.

#### LATIN MASS PROPERS: FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY

**INTROIT:** Proverbs 23: 24, 25 The father of the just rejoiceth greatly, let Thy father and Thy mother be joyful, and let her rejoice that bore Thee. Psalm 83: 2-3 How lovely are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of Hosts! My soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. *V. Glory* be to the Father.

COLLECT O Lord Jesus Christ, who when Thou wast subject to Mary and Joseph didst sanctify the home life with ineffable virtues: grant that by their assistance, we may be instructed by the example of Thy Holy Family and become partakers of their eternal happiness: Who livest and reignest.

EPISTLE: Colossians 3: 12-17 Brethren: Put ye on therefore, as the elect of God, holy, and beloved, the depths of mercy, benignity, humility, modesty, patience: bearing with one another and forgiving one another if any have a complaint against another. Even as the Lord hath forgiven you, so do you also. But above all these things have charity, which is the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ rejoice in your hearts, wherein also you are called in one body: and be ye thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you abundantly, in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms, hymns, and spiritual canticles, singing in grace in your hearts to God. All whatsoever you do in word or in work, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, giving thanks to God and the Father by Him.

GRADUAL: Psalm 26: 4; 83: 5 One thing I have asked of the Lord, this will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life. *V.* Blessed are they that dwell in Thy house, O Lord, they shall praise Thee for ever and ever. ALLELUIA: Isaias 45: 15 Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* Verily Thou art a hidden God, the God of Israel, the Saviour. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Luke 2: 42-52 When Jesus was twelve years old, they going up into Jerusalem according to the custom of the feast, and having fulfilled the days, when they returned, the Child Jesus remained in Jerusalem, and His parents knew it not. And thinking that He was in the company, they came a day's journey, and sought Him among His kinfolks and acquaintance. And not finding Him, they returned into Jerusalem, seeking Him. And it came to pass that after three days they found Him in the Temple, sitting in the midst of the doctors, hearing them and asking them questions. And all that heard Him were astonished at his wisdom and His answers. And seeing Him they wondered. And His mother said to Him: Son, why hast Thou done so to us? Behold Thy father and I have sought Thee sorrowing. And He said to them: How is it that you sought Me? Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business? And they understood not the word that He spoke unto them. And He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was subject to them. And His mother kept all these words in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and grace with God and men.


