Pilgrims of Hope and of Peace!

Hope teaches that the current situation is not hopeless. It is a horizon anda possibility of change in the situation: another world is possible. It breaks fatalism and the irrational belief in an inevitable destiny of poverty: spiritual, economic, social, etc. It holds together in tension the <u>already there</u> observed in Advent, experienced in the present, and the <u>not-yet</u> of the future. It must—if it is also a virtue of God—mobilize for life and enable the action of justice, love, peace and solidarity. This hope is the aspiration and the realization "in faith" of the happiness promised in the Beatitudes: Happy! Blessed! All will be filled!

I carried all our prayers to Rome where I touched the Holy Gate of the Jubilee, 2025.

Lesson (First Reading):

Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10 "Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered: Amen, amen!"

EPISTLE: From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans, 12. 16-21 Brethren: Be not wise in your own conceits. To no man rendering evil for evil: providing good things, not only in the sight of God, but also in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as is in you, have peace with all men. Revenge not yourselves, my dearly beloved, but give place unto wrath, for it is written: Revenge is mine: I will repay, saith the Lord. But if thine enemy be hungry, give him to eat: if he thirst, give him to drink: for doing this, thou shalt heap coals of fire upon his head. Be not overcome by evil, but overcome evil by good.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew 8. 1-13 At that time, when Jesus was come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed Him: and behold a leper came and adored Him, saying: Lord, if Thou wilt, Thou canst make me clean. And Jesus stretching forth His hand, touched him, saying: I will. Be thou made clean. And forthwith his leprosy was cleansed. And Jesus saith to him: See thou tell no man: but go, show thyself to the priest, and offer the gift which Moses commanded for a testimony unto them. And when he had entered into Capharnaum, there came to him a centurion, beseeching Him, and saying: Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, and is grievously tormented. And Jesus saith to him: I will come and heal him. And the centurion making answer, said: Lord, I am not worthy that Thou shouldst enter under my roof: but only say the word, and my servant shall be healed. For I also am a man subject to authority, having under me soldiers; and I say to this one: go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant: Do this, and he doeth it. And Jesus hearing this, marveled, and said to them that followed Him: Amen I say to you, I have not found so great faith in Israel. And I say to you that many shall come from the east and the west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven: but the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. And Jesus said to the centurion: Go, and as thou hast believed, so be it done to thee. And the servant was healed at the same hour.
