


CONFERENCE II: ENGLAND: "ISLAND OF SAINTS" (Conference given on March 14th)

Last Friday we began our Conferences with the account of St. Augustine of Canterbury's Mission from Pope Gregory I to the Isle of once-Roman Britain, which had been overrun by seafaring invading tribes of Angles, Saxons and Jutes. We recalled the encounter of Augustine with King Ethelbert in the wood, and how the Anglo-Saxon King's permission to preach this Christian religion in his realm gave the Holy Ghost the opening for a prodigious conversion among the peoples. The year Augustine began to preach was 597. In less than a century, by the 680s A.D., the whole of England had become Christian.

Let us sketch out some important features about this conversion of Anglo-Saxon England. First, we cite the condition laid down by King Ethelbert to Augustine: they could preach freely and convert whom they might, but the King would have no man be constrained to become a Christian. Even after his own conversion, King Ethelbert did not change his stance. While eager to win others to the Faith, he would not allow for forced conversion.

In his commentary on this aspect of Ethelbert's conversion, the English Jesuit Fr. Herbert Thurston writes approvingly: "The use of force has always been a real enemy to the progress of the Faith-even when it appears for the

moment to have been successful-for it is opposed to the spirit of Our Lord and to the essence of Christianity. The evangelization of the world will be brought about by prayer, by teaching, and by example, but never by force of arms, by persecution or by compulsion of any kind." (<u>Butler's Lives of the Saints</u>, Thurston edition.)

We note then that in the beginning of English Catholicism there is laid the foundation for a great emphasis on what we would call the individual conscience of the believer.

Second, we cite the sound prudential judgment of Pope Gregory in directing Augustine of Canterbury's missionary endeavors. Augustine was very reliant on his communication with Gregory, frequently writing to him, even in minor matters, so tender was his conscience. I will give two examples of Gregory's judgment applied to the mission field in England: 1) Pagan temples were not to be destroyed. Instead, they were to be purified and consecrated for Christian worship; and 2) As far as possible, people's local customs around festivals were to be retained by substituting Catholic religious festivals in their place. "He who would climb to a lofty height," Gregory wrote, "Must go by steps, not leaps."

Here we note another feature of the beginning of English Catholicism: it reflects the Roman mind of classical learning of Pope Gregory the Great. It is temperate, proportionate, and has great respect for the life of the intellect. An outstanding example of the legacy of Pope Gregory, dubbed the "Apostle of England", is *(Continued on Page 9 ...)*

John Henry Cardinal Newman (+1890), who has now been raised to the altars as a Catholic Saint, and whose religious writings are of immense value to us in our present cultural climate.

The figure of St. Bede the Venerable (+735) in many respects epitomizes the best

characteristics of early English Catholicism. It is Bede who has preserved for us the record of the conversion of his nation in his work, the Ecclesiastical History of the English People. He was born before Augustine's mission was yet a century old and the christianization of the English was still a fresh, on-going event. As a seven-yearold child, Bede was entrusted by his relatives to one of the new monasteries.



He writes: "From that time I have spent my whole life in that monastery, devoting all *my efforts to the study of* the Scriptures, and amid the observance of

monastic discipline and the daily charge of singing in the church it has ever been my delight to learn or teach or write ... From the time of my ordination [in my thirtieth year] up till my present fifty-ninth year I have endeavored, for my own use and that of the brethren, to make brief notes upon the Holy Scriptures either out of the works of the venerable fathers or in conformity with their meaning and

interpretation ... And I pray Thee, loving Jesus, that as Thou hast graciously given me to drink in with delight the words of Thy knowledge, so Thou wouldst mercifully grant me to attain one day to Thee, the Fountain of all wisdom, and to appear forever before Thy face.

He that is not with Me is against Me: and he that gathereth not with Me scattereth. When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through places without water, seeking rest: and not finding, he saith: I will return into my house whence I came out. And when he is come, he findeth it swept and garnished. Then he goeth and taketh with him seven other spirits more wicked than himself, and entering in they dwell there. And the last state of that man becomes worse than the first. And it came to pass, as He spoke these things, a certain woman from the crowd, lifting up her voice, said to Him: Blessed is the womb that bore Thee, and the paps that gave Thee suck. But He said: Yea, rather, blessed are they who hear the word of God, and keep it.
